A LETTER FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR

On behalf of the Odyssey board, I would like to express our immense gratitude to the many individuals and organizations who helped us deliver on our mission and commitments - to our scholars and their families, as well as our teachers and staff - throughout this most uncertain and unusual year.

We are equally grateful to our scholars and their families for their hard work and sacrifice throughout the year, and their unwavering commitment to Odyssey. As we reflect on the many obstacles, accomplishments, successes and setbacks experienced by our students and teachers this past year, we are likewise humbled and inspired.

Since 2004, Odyssey has been recognized as a leader in project-based learning that instills a life-long love of learning in more than 375 first through 12th grade students each year. While we re-evaluate our model annually, and adapt our methods to meet the changing needs of our families, this past year created unforeseen challenges which we were jointly successful in confronting.

As a result of the pandemic, we leveraged the experience and learnings from local public and private "virtual school" programs last spring to modify and adapt the Odyssey program for a successful summer of virtual learning and online tutoring. While the program looked quite different from past years, we were overjoyed to have 365 Atlanta-area students participate in their Odyssey summer experience from home.

In addition to our virtual summer program, we were able to deliver more than 800 hours of one-on-one tutoring, 375 learning kits, 30 Chromebooks and Wi-Fi hot spots, over 485 restaurant prepared meals, and targeted financial support for families in need. Two of the many silver linings of this year include establishing a year-round tutoring and mentoring program, and making social and emotional wellness a top priority of our new five-year strategic plan.

We have persevered and we are all stronger as a result. There is simply no doubt that If we can get through a global pandemic, we can get through anything together.

Odyssey is thrilled to announce that we will be returning to campus this year for in-person summer learning. We look forward to all that 2021 has in store for us and thank you for your continued commitment to Odyssey and our families.

Since 2004, Odyssey has served thousands of students from approximately 150 schools and has impacted clusters across the district. In recent years, Odyssey launched a plan to strengthen the overall organization. OUR MODEL



Odyssey has taken a proactive role in addressing academic and social gaps. The use of project-based learning and STEAM-infused curriculum has proven instrumental in the development of our students. Odyssey has long been recognized as a leader in project-based learning and prides itself on creating a fun and exciting learning environment for its students that includes field trips, and experiments and culminates in a final presentation that utilizes the skills attained throughout the 6-week program.


THE CONTINUUM

An Evening Out for Odyssey was led by Co-chairs Kelly McGill and Jacqulin Phillips and raised over \$70,000 in support of Odyssey.










